Dear Ms. Tuck:

Attached are updated maps from our meeting with you and Minister Ramsay last week. The maps now reflect additions to protect representative ecosystems and area removed by the Ontario Parks Board from their earlier proposal. One map summarizes the AFA recommendation and the second map compares it to the Parks Board map. The AFA recommendation agrees with 70% of the area proposed by the Parks Board. The main difference between the two recommendations is less forested area for protection in the AFA proposal. This is to ensure a sustainable wood supply for those mills we discussed.

The following table summarizes the area where forestry would not take place in Algonquin Park using the same methodology as the Parks Board.




